Small-Group Collaboration with Student Control

What is Small-Group Collaboration with Student Control?

Allow two to four students to engage in small-group collaboration (e.g., project-based learning, jigsaw collaboration, independent practice) by toggling between working independently and sharing their screens with peers.

Ensure students join early

- Remind learners to sign-in and **join the Vivi classroom at the start of the lesson** so that you can move to small-group collaboration efficiently when the time comes.

- In **combination with Surround Screen** with Screenshot to transition seamlessly from whole-group to small-group work time
- When designing adult learning professional development to **enable deeper collaboration and ownership**

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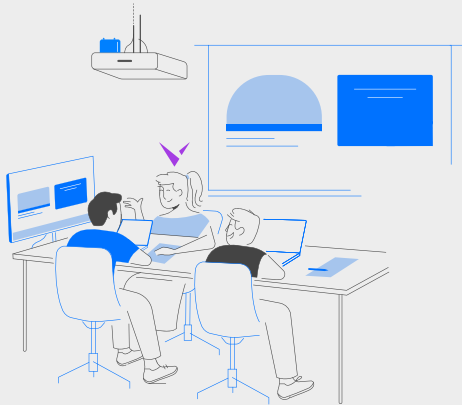

Practice sharing prior to using it in instruction

To help ensure student engagement in small-group collaboration is seamless, practice using Give Student Control with students to build automaticity in low-stakes situations – maybe even with a fun icebreaker!



Designate a Vivi point-person

Roles tend to be helpful in all small-group work, and Small-Group Collaboration with Student Control is no exception. Designate an individual from the group who will be responsible for checking messages and opening collaborative documents.
